The body of the bay window consists:






Inner bay window frame.



Bay window base card Coloured BLUE & GREY.




Bay window top strengthener. Coloured BLUE.




Fold the bay window around the base card, grey side up. Stand on a flat surface and hold all edges firm until the glue has set.



Fit the window frame inside the bay window.
Push firmly into the shape of the outer window and down onto the base card.





Carefully bend the scorelines to form the same shape as the bay window frame.

Fit the blue top card into the recess on the top of the window frame.



Fit the glazing inside the bay window.
Tiny spots of glue around the base.






The bay roof should now sit comfortably on top of the support and the bay window.

Fig. 12. LEAN-TO BUILDING 'C'.

As with the other buildings, fold the yellow tabs back and glue, then fold the walls around the 'L' shaped





Push them all down firmly against the floor This leaves a small ridge at the top for the grey 'L' shaped ceiling to sit in.



Fix the lean-to building against the rear corner of the shop. Then attach the small yellow roof support.




The roof now sits neatly around the building.


Try first before gluing, so that you see where it fits.

Again, fold the yellow tab on the side wall back, then sit the small inner floor on it with the door step sitting on the door opening.



Fit the door with its frame then the window.



Attach the grey card inner support into the corner of the building.









Fig. 14. REAR STEPS.




Fold each of the three rear steps in half on the scoreline shown and glue keeping all edges flush.





Fit the steps in between the two rear lean-to buildings Push up against the right hand lean-to door.

Cover the small space at the other end with the smaller 4th step.



The small rear wall has two tabs, one folds down and one up, to allow the wall to bend and fit against the rear steps.

Finish off with the rear wall capping stone strip.

Fig. 15. LEAN-TO TOILET BUILDING.




This tiny lean-to building has the usual yellow tabs that fold up for the inner grey floor to stand on.


Attach the windows and then the other grey card over it.

Fix to the side wall of the cafe and attach the small roof.



UHU GLUE TUBES





Keep the pin in the nozzle when not in use to stop it from blocking up.

To make the nozzle smaller, put a piece of wire from a medium size paper clip or a large pin inside.

If using the glue frequently, it is not necessary to keep replacing the pin in the nozzle. To stop the glue running out, simply place the tube upright in an empty cup when not in use.




Fig. 16. CHIMNEY STACKS.

To make each chimney stack, start by gluing 4 of the grey former cards together, keeping all edges flush and at rightangles to form a solid block.



4 x grey card formers.


Then wrap the chimney stack around the grey former.



Long stack for bldg. 'A'.

Make sure the top edges of the chimney and the inner block all line up flush.

Short chimney stacks for building 'B'.



Short chimneys simply push down

The longer chimney stack fits into the side opening in building 'A' A spot of glue on the grey former stuck to the side wall will hold it in place.

To finish the roof off properly, the ridge tile strips enhance the kit greatly.
Cut each strip to fit, then locate the scoreline along the centre and fold to fit the ridge of each roof.
Fix with tiny spots of glue place along the ridges.





Fig. 18. CHIMNEY POTS.


Cut out the terracotta coloured strips below and roll tightly around a nail or drill bit (aprox. 4mm. dia.)




Roll up tight

Finish off by cutting pointed edges with a fine knife or scissors.





Glue the two or tree chimney top stones together as shown with each one centred on the one below. When fast, attach the chimney pots and set to one side to dry thoroughly.
