Instruction Sheet

READ THROUGH ALL THE INSTRUCTIONS BEFORE YOU START.

To construct this kit you will need the following:

1. A Modellers knife.
2. Glue - UHU Clear Adhesive is our favourite.
3. A cutting surface - a sheet of card or a cutting mat.
4. Fine point tweezers to hold the smaller components.
5. Metcalfe UltraFine Tip Glue Bottle (Code: MT907)

GETTING STARTED


1 EXTRACTING COMPONENTS FROM SHEETS.

To stop the components from falling off the sheets, they are held secure with score lines marked with a blue arrow. → To release them carefully run your knife along the score lines.

Store the released components in a separate 'Builders Yard'. This is an area kept away from your working surface, keep the components here until needed. Use a tray or thick piece of card to make your builders yard.

Fig. 1 - SHED WALLS


Start off by cutting a small piece of clear plastic from the box window packaging to use as the shed window glazing.



Carefully align the glazing behind the window frames.



Next add the joiner to one side of the rear wall before wrapping the walls around the base.




2 PAINTING CORNERS & EDGES.

The white card that shows on the corners and edges is best painted **before you build the kit**.

All you need is a simple set of water colour paints and a fine brush.

Mix your colour with lots and lots of water, apx. 1 part paint to 5 parts water or more.
TEST ON WASTE CARD FIRST UNTIL YOU HAVE THE CORRECT SHADE & COLOUR.



Then wipe away any paint that has run onto the printed surface before it dries.

Remember, you only need to just slightly tint the card with a little colour.

DON'T paint a thick solid line down the edges, you will only make it look worse.

The walls go together the same for both garden and potting sheds.



Now add the roofs to both sheds, make sure they sit centred.



Lastly add the 2 barge boards to both ends of the larger garden shed.
